The Canada-Guyana Mental Health Project

The Canada-Guyana Mental Health Project is now in its third year and is collaboration between Canadian mental health workers and the Ministry of Health in Guyana.

In 2014, with the gracious assistance of Guyana Christian Charities (Canada) Inc., this project brought 19 mental health professionals from southern Ontario to Guyana for 10 days. The team included psychiatrists, nurses, chaplains, social workers, family physicians and an anesthetist. This endeavor included clinical work and teaching of physicians, students, and nurses in Georgetown, New Amsterdam, Linden, and Suddie.

TRIBUTE

Joan Gloria De Barros (da Silva) was born in Guyana on October 2nd, 1929 into a family of Catholic faith. She was the fourth of nine children and was the eldest girl. She and her husband, Desmond, migrated to Canada in 1963 and have never turned their backs on the people of Guyana, as they both devoted much of their time in Canada to helping Guyanese.

Joan's great life work was her involvement with charity and faith. She was one of the founding members for Guyana Christian Charities (Canada) Inc.; Caribbean North Charities Foundation (originally known as Guyana Burn & Healthcare Charitable Foundation); St. Bartholomew Catholic Women's League; St. Rose's Alumni and the Stella and Flavio da Silva Scholarship Foundation. She was also the GCC Secretary from 1996 to 2001, sat on any committee as needed (and these were many). Her guidance and experience were always greatly appreciated.

Joan and her husband Desmond were both presented with The Lifetime Achievement Leadership award 2008 from The Guyana Awards Council (Canada) and the Consulate General of Guyana in Toronto, in recognition for their great services to the community of Guyana mainly through two specific organizations, Guyana Christian Charities (Canada) Inc.; and Guyana Burn & Healthcare Charitable Foundation, which they helped to establish. Joan was very dedicated and committed to these organizations and was involved in all phases of activities: fundraising; baking; obtaining food and essential items; packingshipping and delivery; acquiring hospital equipment, medications, attaining assistance from doctors and nurses: and ensuring those in need received the assistances that were provided. She has been a formidable force for the good in all of the charitable organizations that she was involved with. Joan truly enjoyed working to provide for others, especially for the less fortunate. Her active community service and commitment to Guyana have inspired other Guyanese-Canadians to do likewise.

Joan is survived by her husband Desmond with whom she has been married for 64 years this April; her 5 children, Andrew, Bruce, Conrad, Desiree, Elliott, 9 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren.

Guyana's History You thought you knew

- Q: He was born and grew up in New Amsterdam, Berbice in Guyana. He lived in Trinidad, England, Canada and Barbados, finally settling in England. Notable among his writings was the Kaywana Series. Who was he?
- A: Edgar Mittelholzer, the most prolific of all West Indian writers of his day. Most of his novels have been translated into French, Italian, Dutch and Spanish.
- Q: When did Berbice have a significant settlement of Jews?
- A: In 1639, a number of Jews, fleeing religious persecution in Brazil, settled in what was then the Dutch colony of Berbice. They later moved to Suriname.
