Dev. John O'Connor and Dr. Tony Carr have been members of Guyana Christian Charities **N**(Canada) Inc. for many years and visit Guyana annually to assist in various areas, especially in the education of nurses at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital. The following is a true story related by Dr. Carr while still on their current visit to Guyana, which is expected to end in November 2010.

When Rev. John and I (Dr. Tony) visited Georgetown last year we taught in Mercy Hospital nursing school for 3 months. The girls sat in rows of ancient wooden desks, darkened with age, neat in their spotless white uniforms, scribbling notes into their books from the blackboard. BUT - we noticed a "computer den" just 3 doors along, with 6 desktop computers all connected to the Internet! And we thought ... We also helped teach at King of Glory church in Bellevue, on the West Bank near Wales. They had built a community hall behind the (Lutheran) church, and had started free classes for children after school and at weekends. They had just one old computer (and no internet) - but they were really keen to start computer classes too ...

So we returned to Canada (March 2009) with ideas. You folks at GCC were hugely encouraging. We went round our local churches in Hamilton asking for old fully working computers, and people were so generous - we obtained about 50 computers, printers, etc., then...to pack and get them to GCC! With the help of my BIG son-in-law and an even bigger Army Officer friend we managed. The Reigbers were wonderfully patient and helpful, and within a month or so happy messages arrived from King of Glory: 'The

computers are here!'

This may be a surprise to many of you – as it was for some of our members. We usually include several boxes of medical supplies to them in our regular shipments and will certainly continue to do so. We will keep you up-to-date as more information becomes available.

n our last newsletter there were two (2) articles featured on Educational Program. The response was wonderful. We have been able to renew 11 scholarships. Some of our supporters sponsor full scholarships but ... most are the result of 'joint efforts'. Yes, we have groups of people who, together, sponsor one scholarship. Several people donate \$100.00 per year – with a 5year guarantee to ensure that the scholarship takes the student through to graduation. This works – it is a super way to help. We had planned to teach our nursing students through a self-instruction method called Problem-Based Learning - which needs lots of Internet time. But Mercy Hospital lost many computers in the big fire (the compound looks so empty now!) There were only two left - totally inadequate for 13 students.

VVith the help of a group from King of Glory where we are teaching Computer technology, we have been able to have 5 computers working in the Hospital den and Rev. John donates his laptop during class time. All this has brought about quite a change in the nursing students.

Guyana Christian Charities (Canada) Inc.'s (GCC) second shipment for the year, a 40ft. container with 768 boxes of donated articles, will soon arrive in Guyana for distribution. These donations consist of clothing, shoes, lots of toys, bicycles, books, fabrics, sewing machines, crutches, folding chairs, medical supplies and equipment and miscellaneous items. The joys of the coming Christmas Season will be enhanced for the recipients of these gifts. Thanks to all of our generous donors.

Significant generosity was shown by a number of donors with valuable contributions. Guyana's History You thought you knew

- Q. How many areas of biological interest have been identified for a National Protected Area System in Guyana?
- A. About 14 areas of biological interest have been identified as possible hotspots for a National Protected Area System. Guyana has one of the largest unspoiled rainforests in South America, some parts of which are almost inaccessible by humans. More than 80% of Guyana is still covered by forests, ranging from dry evergreen and seasonal forests to mountain and lowland evergreen rain forests. These forests are home to more than a thousand species of trees. Guyana's tropical climate, unique geology, and relatively pristine ecosystems support extensive areas of species-rich rain forests and natural habitats which is endemic to Guyana. Approximately eight thousand species of plants occur in Guyana, half of which are found nowhere else. Guyana is one of the countries with the highest biodiversity in the world. Guyana, with 1,168 vertebrate species, 1,600 bird species, boasts one of the richest mammalian fauna assemblages of any comparably sized area in the world.
