PACKING AND SHIPPING UPDATE



On September 24, 2014, a 40-ft container was loaded by our volunteers for shipment to Guyana. This shipment will leave Port Halifax on October 2nd and is expected to arrive in Guyana on October 16th. This is GCC's second shipment for the year and the container was laden with Christmas supplies consigned to over 60 different organizations, institutions and charitable groups across Guyana. The cargo consisted of toys, games, school supplies, Christmas decorations, clothing and shoes for children (all ages) and women, medical supplies and equipment, bicycles, kitchen utensils, bed linens, towels and Christmas treats.

Special thanks to the number of persons and organizations that made significant donations to be distributed across the land to help make the Festive Season more enjoyable. Thirty shoe boxes packed with presents and treats donated by Allison Caldeira will certainly make the sick children at Mercy Hospital feel relatively better. As customary, Sister Lauren Harry and Wendy Grenada will be in Guyana to distribute a large number of items to the less fortunate during the Christmas Seasons.

Thanks to Ken Singh of Atlas Cargo for the huge donation of medical supplies to be utilized by the Health Sector. Our donor from Montreal continues to give generously to the program.



A British Guiana One-Cent Magenta postage stamp from 1856, the only one of its kind to still exist, sold for a record **\$9.5 million** at Sotheby's on Tuesday.

The hefty price, which includes the buyer's premium, makes the one-inch by one-and-a-quarter-inch stamp (2.5 cm by 3.2 cm) printed in black on magenta paper the most expensive stamp ever sold at auction, and the most valuable object by weight and size, according to the auction house.

Guyana's History You thought you knew

- Q: When did the British officially acquire Guyana (British Guiana)?
- A: The colonies of Essequibo, Demerara, and Berbice were officially ceded to the United Kingdom in the Anglo-Dutch Treaty of 1814 and at the Congress of Vienna in 1815. In 1831 they were consolidated as British Guiana and Boundary lines of British Guiana in 1896.
- Q: When did Guyana achieve independence?
- A: Guyana achieved independence on May 26, 1966, and became the Co-operative Republic of Guyana on February 23, 1970 the anniversary of the Cuffy slave rebellion with a new constitution.
