## PACKING & SHIPPING UPDATE

The 40-ft. container of charitable items consisting of 822 packages of clothing, hospitable beds, medical supplies, computers, a lawn mower, bicycles, school supplies. etc. were shipped and arrived in Guyana on October 2020 and were distributed to all the consignees.

Several letters of thanks and gratitude were sent by the recipients to Guyana Christian Charities (GCC). These letters expressed the sincere appreciation and gave us the encouragement to continue our charitable activities. Please note the letter from Ptolemy Reid Rehabilitation Centre in the "Thank You" section below. Our dedicated members, volunteers and executives work tirelessly to assist the less fortunate folks in Guyana.

The Covid-19 pandemic has made these activities much more challenging, but the need is even greater. Thanks to the generosity of all the donors, and the dedication of our members and volunteers who continue to pack from their homes to prevent a cluster in order to keep healthy.

Our next shipment is scheduled for April/May 2021 with about 500 boxes, already packed, for 60 different organizations. Our fundraising activities had to be cancelled because of the epidemic, but thanks to several supporters who made financial donations to boost our ability to meet the cost of shipment and other commitments e.g. to orphanages in Guyana. # Another First

Surgical Associates Guyana has introduced laser treatment of kidney stones at the **St. Joseph Mercy Hospital**. This technique uses a high intensity laser beam to pulverize stones through an endoscope.

The **St. Joseph Mercy Hospital** is the first and only hospital in the country with the equipment and expertise to offer this modern method of treatment.

Surgical Associates Guyana, based at the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, is a group of young Guyanese surgeons who are highly skilled in their respective fields. **They have a common mission of providing the Guyanese people with first world level surgical care. This significant investment is a reflection of their commitment to the development of healthcare in this country.**

The first case of a kidney stone treated with the laser in Guyana was a 34-year-old female with a 1.1cm stone in the kidney. The patient was successfully treated at the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital and was discharged within hours of the procedure. Traditionally, this would have required an incision on the abdomen, two to three days of hospitalization and weeks of convalescence.

## Collaboration with the Lions Club

St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, in collaboration with the Lions Club, held a health outreach last Saturday, November 21, in the Bel Air area. Over 60 patients were able to have blood sugar, blood pressure and other medical checks done free of charge. Those who were found to require further medical attention were referred to the St Joseph Mercy Hospital.



The two organizations usually collaborate to hold this event twice in the year, but owing to the Covid-19 pandemic, this is the only time it was held for 2020.▯

The surgery was performed by **Dr. Rajendra Sukhraj, a trained specialist urological surgeon.** Dr. Sukhraj is highly experienced in treating kidney stones with the laser. He returned to Guyana one year ago after completing a post-graduate degree in Urology at the University of the West Indies.

## LET US TRY TO DO OUR PART

1. Stay at home if you are sick or at higher risk for serious illness from COVID-19
2. If you must go out in public, avoid crowds or contact with people who are sick -- keep your distance and wear a mask and stay away six-feet from others -- wash cloth masks in boiling water with a dash of bleach or disinfectant before reusing them.
3. Do NOT touch your face, nose or eyes with unwashed hands
4. Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds often, especially after being in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
5. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily, -- tables, doorknobs, light switches, handles, desks, computers, phones, keyboards, sinks, toilets, faucets and countertops.
6. Do not track bacteria into your home. After being outside:
  - a. Do not walk around the house in your shoes.
  - b. If you have pets and walked them outside, remember to wash your pet's paws when you get home. Do not let your dog or cat wander in and out of the house as it pleases.
  - c. Remove your clothes and put them in the laundry (wash with detergent and disinfectant later). Do not sit on couch or bed until you have showered, etc.
7. Strengthen your immune system with vitamin C, fish oil, curcumin, garlic oil, zinc, selenium and vitamin D supplements
8. See a doctor if you have the flu.
9. Keep your living areas clean with disinfectant.
10. Stay calm


