Guyana Christian Charities Canada Inc. (CCG) continues to receive and pack donations of used articles from a wide group of donors, including donors from outside of the Metro Toronto area. Our volunteers travel for miles to collect, load and bring these donations to the sorting and packing location at century 21 where our dedicated volunteers would sort, pack and allocate the donations according to the needs and requests from a wide range of the less fortunate people of Guyana. After weeks and months of this activity and after enough boxes and items to fill a 40ft. container was ready they would be transported to the shipper and loaded into the container for shipment.

On May 25th, 2022, a 40ft. container with 1,040 pieces valued at over \$50,000. was shipped to Guyana on board the vessel ZIM LEO/31/S. The cost of the shipment was obtained from the proceeds of GCC fund-raising activities which are supported by the Guyanese diaspora and friends in Toronto. Thanks to all who continue to support our efforts and mandate.

This shipment consisted of men's, women's and children's clothing, bikes, wheelchairs, food items, books, eyeglasses, school supplies, crutches, walkers, canes, medical supplies, TV's and kitchen utensils. With the continued help from Food For The Poor and John Fernandes and staff, the donations were delivered to over 61 organizations, hospitals and individuals across Guyana.

Discovered in a basement in 1873 by a Scottish schoolboy amongst his uncle's stamp collection, it made its way through several hands before reaching Arthur Hind in 1922 who reportedly outbid three kings for the price of \$36,000. It has since increased in value substantially, causing stamp collectors across the globe to dust off their old stamps and have them appraised.

The **British Guiana 1c magenta** is regarded by many philatelists as the world's most famous rare stamp. It was issued in limited numbers in British Guiana (now Guyana) in 1856, and only one specimen is now known to exist. It is the only major postage stamp ever issued that is not represented in Britain's Royal Philatelic Collection

With its U\$\$9,480,000 sale on 17 June 2014 to Stuart Weitzman, this item broke the world record for a single stamp auction price each of the last four times it has been sold. The stamp was auctioned again on 8 June 2021 for the price of \$8,307,000. Beginning November 8, 2021, individuals are able to purchase fractional ownership of the stamp from Stanley Gibbons.





Below are excerpts from various articles published in Guyana. However, we would be remiss not to mention Sister Noel's connection with Guyana Christian Charities (Canada) Inc.

From our inception in 1987 Sister Noel was always supportive and was extremely gracious to GCC for the help given to the Boy's Orphanage and the start-up of the Mercy Boy' Home ... and her guidance regarding helping these institutions, as well as the Mercy Hospital. We were always honored and happy to see Sister Noel on the occasions that she visited Canada. May she rest in peace. Amen.

"One of Guyana's greatest historians and educators, Sister Mary Noel Menezes, affectionately called "Sister Menezes" has passed away on August 31, 2022. She was 92 years old and in the 75th year of religious life.

Sr. Menezes (born in 1930) was a Roman Catholic nun belonging to the Order of the Sisters of Mercy. She entered the sisters of Mercy community in Dallas, Pennsylvania, USA in 1947 and took her vows as a Religious Sister in 1950.

Sr. Menezes was a historian and former University of Guyana lecturer. She was involved with the University of Guyana from 1967 to her death in 2022, as a lecturer, head of department, full professor, and as professor emeritus.

She made a significant contribution to Guyana as professor of history at the University of Guyana for 23 years. In 1973 she not only transformed the History Department into one of the best in the Caribbean at the time but also initiated the university's first Master's Degree Program – a Master of Arts in Guyanese and West Indian History. She served as the Chief Co-ordinator of this program for 17 years, from its inception to her retirement in 1990.

Sr. Menezes, who held a PhD in history from the University of London for her ground-breaking dissertation "British policy towards Guyanese Amerindians in the 19th century", spent most of her academic life at the University of Guyana. Sr. Menezes's pioneered work in Indigenous and Portuguese history.

She produced four books on these two subjects, namely, *British Policy Towards the Amerindians in British Guiana*, 1803-1873 (Oxford: Clarendon Press, 1977); *The Amerindians in Guyana 1803-1873*. A Documentary History (London: Frank Cass and Co. Ltd., 1979); *Scenes from the History of the Portuguese in Guyana* (London: The Author, 1986); and *The Portuguese of Guyana: A Study in Culture and Conflict* (Gujurat): The Anand Press, 1992).

In 2017, at the age of 87, she launched her new book entitled 'Guyana and the Wider World', which featured a collection of her essays and addresses.

Two other of her numerous publications are particularly cherished by students. Her book, The Amerindians and the Europeans is one of the most informative sources of knowledge for this popular theme in the Caribbean Examinations Council (CXC) Caribbean History syllabus. Secondly, her Guide to Historical Research, later revised with a new title, How To Do Better Research, continues to be an invaluable guide especially to university students in all disciplines on research methodology.

A passionate and charismatic teacher, Sr. Menezes trained a new generation of professional Guyanese historians and public figures. These include former President David Granger, Dr. James Rose, Dr. David Chanderbali, Mr. Tota Mangar, Ms. Cecelia McAlmont, Dr. Basdeo Mangru, Dr. Marguerite Chase-Garvey and Dr. Kimani Nehusi.

In addition to her prolific historical research, Sr. Menezes was also well known for her work at St John Bosco Orphanage, for boys aged three to sixteen (3 to 16) in Plaisance which she ran from 1968 to 2003.

In 2000, she founded the Mercy Boys' Home in Georgetown for boys 16 and over, to help them transition to adult life.

She also served on the council of St. Joseph Mercy Hospital from 1985 to 2002.

Over the years, Sr. Menezes received several honorary doctorates from universities all over the world, including the University of the West Indies in 2005.

She was awarded the Golden Arrow of Achievement by the Guyanese government in 1982, and in 2015 was inducted into the Order of Roraima.

A true national treasure, Sr. Menezes, will be remembered not only for her mountainous contribution to Guyanese history but also through her teachings and love for her students and 'Bosco boys'.

•	Guyana's History You thought you knew
Q:	Which group of indigenous groups first inhabited Guyana?
A:	The first indigenous groups to inhabit Guyana were the Carib (Galibi or Kalinago), Arawak (Taino), Warrau, Wayana and Akawai.
Q:	How many indigenous peoples are there in Guyana?
A:	Indigenous Peoples in Guyana are home to nine distinct Indigenous peoples - Lokono (Arawak), Akawaio (Kapon), Arecuna (Pemon), Macusi, Warrau, Wapisiana, Wai Wai, Patamona and Kalina (Carib).
Q:	Where did Guyana's first inhabitants live?
A :	The large meeting house in Masakenari – a remote WaiWai village in Guyana. (James Broscombe) It is generally believed that Guyana's first inhabitants, the Amerindians, originally entered the territory of what is now known as Guyana about 11,000 years ago. Initially they lived on the low, swampy coastland region. The Amerindians settled mostly in the forested regions of Guyana, and as such they maintained a primitive lifestyle of hunting and fishing. Consequently, they developed very strong jungle survival skills




